Why Mothering Matters Tackling the Problem of Calgary's Hungry Children

Calgary, AB – Imagine hearing and feeling your stomach growl, and realizing that you have nothing to stop the hunger. That's the daily condition for approximately 30,000 children and youth in Calgary (Feeding Calgary's Children Initiative).

On May 14th at 9am, Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids is inviting the media to step inside their commercial kitchen and see first hand how this organization is helping to tackle childhood hunger one brown bag lunch at a time. By providing over 1000, brown bag lunches a day to children whether in the streets or in school, they hope to draw attention to a very real problem in their city.

"The fact that there are thousands of hungry children in a city that calls itself the heart of the new west is heartbreaking. If we want to be a progressive and compassionate society then we must broaden our idea of motherhood and truly care for those around us," says Christy Fisher, Brown Bagging's Community Outreach Coordinator.

Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids also caught the eye of Maryanne Pope, a Calgary film producer, while filming the documentary entitled *Whatever Floats your Boat...Perspectives on Motherhood*.

"We decided to use the documentary to try and help raise awareness about childhood hunger by promoting the concept that mothering goes beyond raising our own children. This is a problem we all need to rally around and help solve," commented Maryanne, the CEO of Pink Gazelle Productions.

Established in 1990, Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids reaches out to all children and youth in need through the provision of essential nutrients necessary for healthy growth and development. It also acts as a catalyst in the development of community-based solutions to break down barriers caused by malnutrition.

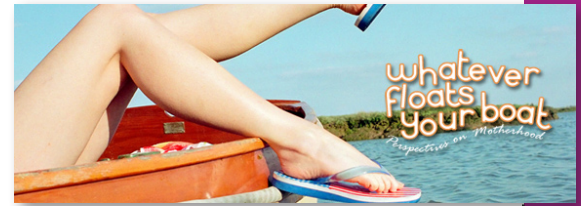
